

Policy – Eligibility and Allocation

Policy Statement

BeyondHousing establishes eligibility criteria, for long-term housing, to ensure housing is made available to relieve households from housing stress.

Purpose

The purpose of this policy is to outline:

- Eligibility for BeyondHousing long term social housing properties
- Allocation of vacant properties
- Strengthening local communities

Scope

This policy applies to all long-term properties owned by BeyondHousing.

This policy does not apply to the following BeyondHousing programs:

- Transitional Housing Management (THM) program
- Properties managed by BeyondHousing on behalf of other property owners where the owner retains responsibility for eligibility and allocation of housing.

Policy Detail

BeyondHousing will:

- Communicate clearly to applicants as to who is eligible for long term housing with BeyondHousing.
- Only allocate long term housing to eligible applicants in a manner which is fair and equitable.
- Comply with its contractual, legal, and regulatory obligations relating to eligibility and allocation.
- Allocate housing that:
 - o Gives appropriate priority to households in need of housing assistance.
 - o Considers the health, safety, and support needs of applicants.
 - Matches individual housing needs with available properties.
 - Strengthens local communities.

Eligibility

BeyondHousing participates in the Victorian Housing Register (VHR). The VHR is a common register for all applicants for public housing and community housing in Victoria.

The Department of Families, Fairness and Housing (DFFH) has established common eligibility criteria for the VHR, click here to access the DFFH criteria.

There are five criteria an applicant must meet to be eligible for a social housing property from the register::

- Proof of identity
- Australian citizen or Permanent resident
- Victorian resident
- Income eligibility.
- Asset eligibility;

Allocation

BeyondHousing will comply with all requirements of the VHR's allocation framework; click <u>here</u> for a copy of the framework.

BeyondHousing will:

- Source suitable applicants from the VHR.
- Match applicants to properties so that an allocation:
 - o Is the right size for the applicant's household.
 - Is in an area appropriate for the applicant's needs.
 - Makes the best use of housing stock.
 - Encourages a sustainable tenancy.

Strengthening local communities

BeyondHousing may adopt different allocation strategies in response to:

- A high concentration of public and community housing stock in a particular area
- Existing neighbourhood tensions or disputes which may be intensified if allocations are not sensitively handled.
- A mismatch of supply and demand making the property hard to let.

Human Rights Considerations

In making decisions, BeyondHousing must give proper consideration to the relevant human rights in accordance with the Charter of Human Rights and Responsibilities Act 2006 s38(1) (the charter).

This consideration should include the potential impact the proposed action we are undertaking may have on the applicants (and their household's) rights under the Charter.

Definitions

Applicant: A person who has applied for housing via the VHR or directly to BeyondHousing

DFF: Department of Families, Fairness and Housing

Director of Housing: The Victorian government statutory authority that owns public housing land in Victoria and

the primary funding body for community housing.

Priority Access: Applicants on the VHR who have been assessed as having priority housing need. The Priority

Access categories are:

Emergency Management Housing

Priority Transfers

• Homeless with Support

Supported Housing

• Temporary Absence

• Special Housing Needs

Special Housing Needs (Aged 55 years and over)

Public Housing: Housing owned and managed by DFFH.

Social Housing: The properties that are considered Social Housing under agreements between

BeyondHousing and the Director of Housing.

Transitional Housing: The Victorian Government program providing housing on a short-term basis to people

homeless or at risk of homelessness.

VHR: The Victorian Housing Register, the state-wide common application for people seeking

public housing and community housing.
